

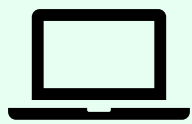
HEAT IN PAEDIATRICS

DO YOU WORK IN THE NHS WITH CHILDREN OR NEONATES?

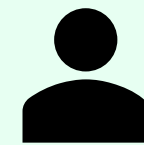

WHO CAN TAKE PART?

To participate, you must:

- Work in an acute NHS trust in England
- Regularly work with children and young people
- Be a clinician (e.g. doctor, nurse, midwife, AHP, pharmacist) or a ward or operations manager
- Have experienced overheating at work in the last 5 years

You do not need to be a paediatric specialist, as long as you have experienced overheating whilst caring for children in your role

WHAT DOES IT INVOLVE?

- Participate in an online 1 hour interview with the research team from Greener NHS
- Share your experiences of working in hot conditions and how it impacted you, your colleagues and your patients
- Discuss ideas for improving future heatwave preparedness, response and resilience to help guide adaptation to climate change
- Sessions will be recorded before being transcribed and anonymised to store on encrypted, secure servers
- Published findings will be fully anonymised
