Call for abstracts

Core papers

Core papers should:

- be relevant to the theme
- set a high standard for other papers
- include research and critical analysis to stimulate discussion
- display academic scholarship in research, conceptual analysis and new insights
- reflect the conference's international focus.

Theme papers

Theme papers are presented after the core paper within their subject groups. They should address the theme, be innovative and contribute to the debate.

Posters with best poster prize donated by Elsevier

Posters should address topical, innovative and emerging issues regarding the future of healthcare education. There will be a prize, kindly donated by Elsevier, for the best poster.

Student papers

We welcome papers from students, particularly under the 'Enhancing the Student Experience' theme. This is an ideal opportunity for students to share their ideas in a supportive and inclusive environment.
